

eviQ Cancer Genetics – Risk management documents

Summary of changes – September 2023

The following changes have been applied to the eviQ cancer genetics risk management documents to align with the new template. **Note:** some changes may not apply in certain documents.

Document section	Details
Flag at top of protocol	Where the terms “male” or “female” are used in a document, the following flag has been added: “In this document the terms ‘male’ and ‘female’ refer to sex assigned at birth. For more information about providing individualised care refer to Resources to assist in the care of transgender individuals referred to a clinical genetics service or familial cancer centre. ”
Summary	“Family history” added to the existing template sentence: “The care of an individual who has developed a related tumour or cancer should be individualised based on their clinical situation, their family history and the monitoring they need as part of their treatment and post-treatment follow-up.”
Cancer/tumour risk management guidelines	Added: “Risks and benefits of interventions should be discussed with an experienced medical professional.” Updated existing lifestyle sentence from "exercise regularly" to: “...exercise most days for at least 30 minutes at moderate or strenuous intensity...”
